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Preserving Local Wisdom: Unaizah's Coffee Culture and Dates Farming Sustaining Cultural Heritage

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Abstract: This article explores the profound significance of Unaizah's coffee culture and dates farming in sustaining the region's cultural heritage. It highlights the unique relationship between coffee shops and dates farms, emphasizing their role in sustaining the economy, society, and environment while safeguarding local wisdom. Unaizah, renowned for its dates farming and traditional coffee cultures, holds a prominent position in global agriculture. This article delves into the historical context, economic implications, societal dynamics, and ecological sustainability intertwined with Unaizah's coffee culture and dates farming. The findings unequivocally demonstrate the pivotal role of these practices in preserving local wisdom and cultural heritage, underscoring the importance of understanding and honoring Unaizah's distinctive traditions in an everchanging world.

INTRODUCTION

Preserving cultural heritage and local wisdom is an essential endeavor that ensures the continuity and flourishing of a community's identity, traditions, and values. Within the vibrant tapestry of Unaizah, a city nestled in the heart of Saudi Arabia, the intermingling practices of coffee culture and dates farming have emerged as powerful guardians of local wisdom (Mungmachon, 2012; Maspul, 2022; Alzaidi *et al.*, 2018). This introduction sets the stage for an in-depth exploration of the preservation of local wisdom through the symbiotic relationship between coffee and dates farming in Unaizah, unveiling three strong objectives that drive this study. The first objective of this study is to delve into the historical significance and cultural context surrounding local coffee culture and dates farming in Unaizah. By tracing the origins and evolution of these practices, understanding their cultural symbolism, and exploring the deep-rooted traditions associated with coffee and dates, we aim to establish a comprehensive historical framework. This objective seeks to uncover the intrinsic connection between coffee and dates farming and the preservation of local wisdom within the Unaizah community. By delving into historical narratives and cultural contexts, we can unravel the rich tapestry of Unaizah's traditions and the role played by coffee and dates farming in shaping its cultural heritage.

The second objective of this study centers on examining the economic implications and sustainability aspects of local coffee culture and dates farming in Unaizah. We aim to analyze the economic contributions of these practices, including their role in local livelihoods, market

dynamics, and income generation. By exploring the economic value chains associated with coffee and dates production, processing, and trade, we can assess their significance in sustaining the local economy. Moreover, we will investigate the sustainable agricultural practices employed in coffee and dates farming, focusing on environmental conservation, resource management, and long-term viability (Maspul, 2023; Moalem & Mosgaard, 2021; Ukers, 1935). This objective aims to shed light on the economic and ecological dimensions that contribute to the preservation of local wisdom in Unaizah, ensuring its continued prosperity for future generations.

The third objective of this study is to assess the social dynamics and community engagement related to local coffee culture and dates farming in Unaizah. We will delve into the social fabric woven by these practices, exploring how coffee shops serve as vibrant community spaces and gathering points for knowledge exchange, storytelling, and cultural transmission. Additionally, we will investigate the intergenerational transfer of knowledge and traditions associated with al coffee culture and dates farming, highlighting the role played by local communities, farmers, and stakeholders in preserving and promoting local wisdom (Shalowitz *et al.*, 2009; Henrikson *et al.*, 2013). This objective seeks to provide insights into the social cohesion and community-driven initiatives that sustain Unaizah's cultural heritage, fostering a sense of identity, belonging, and pride among its residents.

Moreover, by pursuing these three in-depth objectives, this study aims to uncover the intricate interplay between coffee and dates farming and the preservation of local wisdom in Unaizah. The findings will contribute to the scholarly discourse on cultural preservation, sustainable agriculture, and community engagement, while providing practical insights for stakeholders, policymakers, and community members interested in safeguarding and celebrating Unaizah's rich cultural heritage.

METHOD

This study employs a qualitative methodology combining exploratory research and a comprehensive literature review to delve into the preservation of local wisdom through coffee culture and dates farming in Unaizah, Saudi Arabia. The research problem is identified and framed around understanding the multifaceted aspects of preserving local wisdom in Unaizah, considering its status as the largest dates farm globally and the historical significance of traditional Arabic coffee (Saudi coffee) in the region.

The methodology includes an extensive review of existing literature, encompassing academic articles, books, and other relevant sources to establish a solid foundation of knowledge. Primary data is collected through field visits, interviews, and observations with coffee professionals, dates farm owners, coffee shop proprietors, and community members to extract valuable insights into their experiences and perceptions. Thematic analysis is applied to the qualitative data, while the findings are then synthesized, grounded in the existing literature, and interpreted to provide a comprehensive understanding of how local coffee culture and dates farming sustain local wisdom in Unaizah. The study concludes by highlighting the implications of the findings and offering recommendations for future research and initiatives aimed at the preservation of local wisdom in Unaizah and similar contexts.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

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1. Historical Context of Coffee and Dates Farming in Unaizah

1.1 The Origin and Significance of Coffee

Coffee plays a vital role in global history, society, and economics, contributing to the GDP of many countries. South America leads in production (57%), followed by Asia (31%) and Ethiopia (12%). Brazil and Vietnam are the top producers, contributing 33% and 14% respectively. The specialty coffee sector is experiencing rapid growth, defined as coffee scoring 80 points or above out of 100 (Marina, 2023; GCP, 2020). In Saudi Arabia, coffee holds cultural significance and is a major consumer, with over 170 thousand tons consumed in the past three years, valued at 2.25 billion Saudi riyals. Ethiopia is the primary source of imports, accounting for 72% of total coffee imports. Domestic production is low but growing, with 646 tons produced in 2019, mainly in Jazan, Asir, and Al-Baha regions. By 2022, production had reached 1810 tons. Coffee cultivation in Saudi Arabia generates annual profits between 219 and 354 million dollars, with the Jazan region specializing in a type of coffee known as "Qishr" (ICO, 2020; Walton, 2021; Arabnews, 2023).

Coffee, an esteemed beverage with a rich and storied history, finds its origins deeply rooted in the Arabian Peninsula, particularly in Jazan Saudi Arabia. This section delves into the captivating journey of coffee cultivation, shedding light on its cultural significance and exploring the intricate rituals and traditions that have become intertwined with coffee consumption in the Gulf (Arabnews, 2023; Maspul, 2022a; Alzaidi *et al.*, 2018). Unaizah, renowned for its deep appreciation and consumption of coffee, holds a significant place in the history and culture surrounding this beloved beverage. The city has embraced coffee as an integral part of its social fabric, with its bustling cafes and vibrant coffee culture creating a haven for coffee enthusiasts. Unaizah has become a hub for experiencing and celebrating the diverse flavors and traditions associated with traditional Arabic coffee (Saudi coffee), attracting visitors from near and far to indulge in the rich coffee heritage found within its borders. Unaizah emerged as a hub for trade, with its bustling markets becoming the epicenter for traditional Arabic coffee exchange and the dissemination of coffee knowledge (Al-Samarat, 2015; Al-Hatem, 1981; Al-Sharida, 2022).

The cultural significance of coffee in Unaizah extends far beyond its role as a mere beverage. It has permeated various aspects of daily life, shaping customs, social interactions, and even the region's collective identity. Coffee ceremonies, steeped in tradition and hospitality, hold a special place in the hearts of the people of Unaizah. These ceremonies serve as a platform for fostering connections, where individuals come together to partake in the intricate process of brewing and serving coffee, accompanied by heartfelt conversations and shared moments of respite (BBC, 2022; Maspul, 2022). Through these rituals, coffee acts as a catalyst for community building, strengthening familial ties, and forging new friendships. In the tapestry of Unaizah's coffee culture, the poem "Al-Qahwa" by Muhammad Abdullah Al-Qadi occupies a position of profound significance. Al-Qadi's poetic masterpiece not only captures the essence of Unaizah's coffee heritage but also serves as a testament to the enduring allure of coffee in Arab culture (Al-Samarat, 2015; Al-Hatem, 1981; Al-Sharida, 2022). Through his artful verses, Al-Qadi eloquently expresses the longing for loved ones, employing vivid imagery to liken them to precious gems and aromatic coffee. His poem serves as a poignant reminder of the deep-rooted connection between coffee and human emotions, resonating with the sentiments and experiences shared by the people of Unaizah (Al-Sabah Press, 2013; Al-Jazirah, 2008).

Meanwhile, Muhammad Abdullah Al-Qadi, a renowned poet from Najd, was born in Unaizah in 1224 AH and passed away in 1285 AH (1809 -1868 AD). With expertise in classical and colloquial Arabic literature, he showcased a comprehensive understanding of diverse poetic styles (Al-Samarat, 2015; Al-Hatem, 1981; Al-Sharida, 2022). Al-Qadi's notable work includes the

poem "Al-Qahwa" (Coffee), which celebrates the virtues of coffee, serving as a symbol of solace and yearning. Unaizah's rich coffee culture accentuates the historical significance of the poem, as the city has played a pivotal role in shaping the region's coffee development. Al-Qadi's meticulous portrayal of the coffee brewing process and its sensory allure, including the use of cardamom, saffron, and amber, further enhances the poem's appeal. This article explores the captivating splendor of "Al-Qahwa" and its resonance with Unaizah's coffee culture, capturing the essence of coffee as a beloved symbol in Arab culture. It also acknowledges Al-Qadi's enduring influence on subsequent poets, highlighting the poem's significance in shaping the literary landscape (Al-Samarat, 2015; Al-Sabah Press, 2013; Al-Jazirah, 2008).

Moreover, Unaizah's coffee culture stands as a testament to the enduring legacy of coffee in the Arabian Peninsula. The city's historical role as the birthplace of coffee cultivation, coupled with its vibrant rituals and traditions, has solidified its position as a guardian of the coffee heritage. Through the evocative verses of Al-Qadi's "*Al-Qahwa*," the profound significance of coffee in Unaizah's cultural fabric is immortalized, serving as a vivid testament to the enduring power of this beloved cultural beverage.

1.2 Dates Farming in Unaizah: A Global Hub

Unaizah is renowned as a global hub for dates farming, with its fertile lands and favorable climate making it an ideal location for date palm cultivation. Nestled within the enchanting ambiance of the Unaizah festival, a kaleidoscope of vibrant hues and enticing aromas captivates the senses. Here, amidst the fertile lands and benevolent climate, Unaizah has risen as a coveted global hub for dates farming, its very essence intertwined with the historical, economic, and cultural significance of this timeless craft. Tracing back through the annals of time, Unaizah's date farming legacy is a testament to the region's deep-rooted connection with the land. With meticulous care and unwavering commitment, generations of skilled farmers have nurtured the majestic date palms, passing down their ancestral knowledge like a treasured heirloom (The National, 2021; Alzaidi *et al.*, 2018). This profound heritage has shaped Unaizah's identity, evoking a profound sense of pride among its inhabitants.

Beyond its cultural value, dates farming serves as the heartbeat of Unaizah's economy. The abundant harvests, nurtured by nature's benevolence and the farmers' unwavering dedication, yield a cornucopia of succulent dates that not only sustain the local population but also extend their influence far beyond the kingdom's borders (Elsabea, 201; Thompson *et al.*, 2012). Unaizah's dates, renowned for their unrivaled taste and quality, become ambassadors of Arabian sweetness, captivating palates around the globe. From the bustling markets of nearby nations to the distant corners of the world, Unaizah's dates find their way, enriching trade and bolstering the region's economic prosperity. Yet, the significance of dates in Unaizah transcends mere commerce. They are the embodiment of a cultural symbol deeply ingrained in the traditions and rituals of the region. Dates are interwoven into the tapestry of life, gracing joyous celebrations, religious observances, and daily nourishment with their presence. Revered as a symbol of generosity, hospitality, and abundance, the date palm stands tall as a revered entity, representing the resilience and vitality of Unaizah and its people (Ibrahim *et al.*, 2021; Al Arabiya, 2020).

The Unaizah festival, meticulously orchestrated by the Unaizah Chamber of Commerce and Industry, stands as a testament to the city's profound reverence for dates farming. This grand event, spanning a month, transforms the Qassim region into a mesmerizing tapestry of millions of palm

trees, their fronds swaying in harmonious rhythm. Beyond the awe-inspiring spectacle, the festival serves as a conduit to honor Unaizah's rich cultural heritage and highlight the economic significance that dates hold for Saudi Arabia. The festival's unwavering commitment to celebrating the bountiful harvest of dates showcases the indomitable spirit and adaptability of Saudi Arabia's date industry, a shining testament to the nation's enduring legacy (SPA, 2022; Alzaidi *et al.*, 2018).

As the festival unfolds, it unveils the grandeur of Saudi Arabia's date farming industry, a testament to the nation's unwavering commitment to excellence. With over 8 million majestic palm trees gracing its landscapes, representing around 25% of the world's date production proudly stands among the top three global producers of dates. This distinction is a testament to the harmonious coexistence of tradition and innovation, as Saudi Arabia maintains its stature as the world's leading oil exporter while nurturing an industry deeply rooted in the land's fertile embrace. The economic impact of dates farming in Saudi Arabia reverberates far and wide. In 2017 alone, the country's date exports reached an impressive volume of 140,000 tonnes, valued at a staggering sum of 700 million riyals (\$187 million) (Al Arabiya, 2020; Arabnews, 2021). This remarkable figure underscores the vital role that dates play in bolstering the national economy, diversifying its revenue streams, and contributing to its global trade prominence. Unaizah, with its unrivaled expertise and abundant harvests, stands as a shining example of this economic prowess.

Furthermore, Unaizah stands as a beacon of excellence in the realm of dates farming, rooted in a historical legacy that spans generations. Its fertile lands, blessed by nature's benevolence, have nurtured an industry that intertwines economic prosperity, cultural symbolism, and the preservation of heritage. As the Unaizah festival continues to enchant visitors, it serves as a vivid testament to the city's unwavering dedication to dates farming, weaving a tale of abundance, tradition, and the enduring spirit of Unaizah.

2. Economic Impact of Coffee Culture and Dates Farming

2.1 Coffee Culture as a Catalyst for Economic Development

The rich heritage and cultural significance of coffee in Saudi Arabia have been instrumental in shaping the country's identity. Coffee has been ingrained in the Saudi Arabian culture for centuries, with its roots tracing back to the 15th century in the Sarawat Mountains (Baabdullah, 2020). It was during this time that coffee beans were first roasted and consumed, giving birth to a tradition that would become deeply intertwined with Arabian hospitality and social gatherings. Public cafés, known locally as *Maqha*, emerged as important communal spaces where people would gather to engage in discussions, share ideas, and savor the aromatic brew. These *Maqha* played a pivotal role in fostering connections and nurturing the intellectual and social fabric of the community. While the cultural significance of coffee has always been recognized within Saudi Arabia, it is only in recent years that it has gained wider recognition as an integral part of the country's historical and cultural heritage (Maspul, 2022b; Ukers 1935).

The Year of Saudi Coffee, a government initiative declared in 2022, aimed to further highlight the importance of coffee in Saudi Arabia. Local farmers, such as Jabar Al-Maliki, whose family has been cultivating coffee for generations, take immense pride in their heritage and traditions. They have embraced the opportunity to share their lives and traditions with outsiders, promoting community-based tourism initiatives that offer a glimpse into the world of Saudi Arabian coffee. The Jazan region, renowned for its prized Khawlani coffee, has emerged as a focal point for tourists seeking to explore the local coffee culture. Khawlani coffee, grown in the high-altitude regions of Jazan, is revered for its exceptional quality. The combination of favorable growing conditions, meticulous harvesting techniques, and precise roasting processes contributes

to its renowned flavor profile. For farmers, the cultivation of Khawlani coffee is not just an agricultural endeavor; it is an art form passed down through generations. The preparation and consumption of this coffee also play a significant role in fostering social bonds and hospitality. Hosts continuously offer small cups of piping hot coffee to their guests as a gesture of respect and care, further strengthening the social fabric of the community (UNESCO, 2022; Maspul, 2022b; Sumarti & Falatehan, 2016).

The Year of Saudi Coffee seeks to promote and share the rich heritage and unique rituals associated with Saudi Arabian coffee. Local coffee growers have embraced digital platforms and social media to showcase their farms and attract visitors. Although tourism in this remote region is still in its early stages of development, there is a hope to expand the recognition of Khawlani coffee beyond the borders of Saudi Arabia. Foreign visitors have started to trickle in, experiencing the warm hospitality of farmers like Al-Maliki, Al-Nakhaifi, and Al-Raithi, who offer coffee tastings, traditional meals, and insights into their centuries-old farming practices. While community-based tourism initiatives are currently limited to a small fraction of the more than 700 coffee farmers, the potential for growth and exploration of Saudi Arabia's coffee culture is vast. Coffee holds a deep significance for Arabs and Saudis, interweaving cultural identity, generosity, and hospitality (UNESCO, 2022; Arabnews, 2023; BBC, 2022). With the increasing recognition and promotion of Saudi coffee, the opportunities for visitors to experience this rich tradition are boundless.

In Unaizah, the establishment of coffee shops within date farms has been instrumental in the region's economic development. This industry not only preserves cultural traditions but also creates jobs, generates income, and boosts tourism. By integrating their date farms into the coffee production process, local coffee farms in Unaizah demonstrate a commitment to sustainability and environmental stewardship. This unique combination of coffee and dates serves as a distinguishing feature for cafes in the area. These cafes directly source their ingredients from nearby farms, supporting local farmers and providing a stable market for their produce. This symbiotic relationship between coffee and date farmers contributes to income generation and economic stability. Additionally, the growth of coffee-related tourism in Unaizah further drives economic development. Tourists are drawn to the distinctive blend of coffee and dates, as well as the cultural heritage associated with Saudi Arabian coffee traditions. The cafes nestled amidst date farms offer visitors an authentic experience while promoting sustainable and responsible tourism practices.

Furthermore, several coffee shops integrated within the date palm orchard environment have been established since the previous year. However, they have now become part of the concept of Jaaddat al Nakhil, a project supported by the Kingdom. Jaaddat al-Nakhil was initiated during the reign of King Salman ibn AbdulAziz, with the groundbreaking ceremony taking place on August 10, 2023, conducted by Prince Faisal ibn Mish'al Al Saud. The project aims to align with the preservation and education of local and Gulf country visitors in safeguarding cultural heritage, including the preservation of Saudi date palm orchards and coffee. Additionally, this location is projected to sustain the strategic plan of the Unaizah Tourism program, developing the central district as a center for cultural heritage in culture and tourism. It also seeks to create economic opportunities for the youth of Al-Qassim, promoting sustainable employment for the local youth, while also fostering local branding to support the local economy.

The first phase of this integrated concept has been completed through support from the government, specifically the Monshaat under the Saudi Human Resources Development Fund. Semi-permanent buildings have been constructed in an integrative manner with the environment, covering an area of 75,000 square meters, currently sustaining the coffee culture and dates farming activities. The establishment of coffee shops within date farms in Unaizah benefits from both the global trend of specialty coffee and the preservation of local traditional coffee culture. Globally, there is a growing demand for specialty coffee, with consumers increasingly seeking unique and high-quality coffee experiences (Raveendran & Murthy, 2022; Maspul, 2022c). Unaizah's coffee farms, known for their commitment to sustainability and traditional cultivation methods, are well-positioned to cater to this demand. By offering specialty Jazan Arabica coffee beans, carefully grown and processed, Unaizah's coffee shops can tap into the global trend, attracting coffee enthusiasts who appreciate the distinctive flavors and craftsmanship associated with local specialty coffee.

At the same time, the integration of local traditional coffee culture adds a distinct charm to Unaizah's coffee establishments. The region's rich coffee heritage, passed down through generations, brings a sense of authenticity and cultural significance to the coffee experience. The rituals, brewing methods, and storytelling associated with traditional coffee preparation create a unique atmosphere that connects visitors with the local community and its customs. This blend of global specialty coffee trends and the preservation of traditional coffee culture sets Unaizah apart as a destination that offers both exceptional coffee quality and a deep cultural experience. Moreover, by capitalizing on the global trend of specialty coffee while preserving and showcasing local wisdom and traditions, Unaizah's coffee shops create a harmonious fusion that appeals to both international and local visitors. The combination of high-quality Arabica beans, sustainable farming practices, and the cultural heritage of coffee preparation ensures a truly memorable and enriching coffee experience in Unaizah.

2.2 Dates Farming: A Key Source of Income

The palm tree is highly valued and mentioned in the Holy Quran and Prophetic traditions. It is an important tree in Saudi Arabia's agricultural policies. A comprehensive guide has been prepared to help with palm tree care and cultivation, covering various aspects such as environmental requirements, propagation, irrigation, pests, and diseases. This guide aims to benefit farmers and anyone interested in palm trees worldwide (NCPD, 2023). Dates farming in Unaizah is a crucial source of income for the local community, sustaining livelihoods, generating export revenues, and providing employment opportunities. The region's favorable climate and fertile soil make date palm cultivation profitable. The income from dates farming improves living standards by supporting basic needs (Goodman, 2008; Shabani et al., 2015). Unaizah's dates are highly sought after, both domestically and internationally, contributing significantly to the region's economy through export revenues and aiding in overall economic growth and development. The demand for dates in the export market has been increasing, making Saudi Arabia, and Unaizah specifically, a major global exporter. This boosts the local economy and contributes to the country's foreign exchange earnings. Dates farming creates employment opportunities for both skilled and unskilled workers throughout the cultivation process. From planting to harvesting, labor is required, providing jobs for the local workforce (Dolan, 2004; Singh, 2003). The labor-intensive nature of dates farming also leads to indirect employment in processing, packaging, transportation, and marketing.

Technological advancements have improved productivity and quality in dates farming. Modern techniques such as drip irrigation optimize water management, reducing water consumption. Integrated pest management and organic farming methods minimize pesticide use, promoting sustainability. Post-harvest handling and processing have been enhanced with improved storage facilities and packaging techniques, ensuring freshness and extending shelf life for export purposes. These technological advancements position Unaizah as an innovative hub in the dates industry, boosting productivity, profitability, and competitiveness in the global market (Anderson *et al.*, 2019; Al-Absi *et al.*, 2021). Moreover, dates farming in Unaizah is a vital economic pillar. It provides income, improves livelihoods, and creates employment opportunities. The export of high-quality dates contributes significantly to the local economy, while technological advancements enhance productivity and sustainability. Dates farming plays a crucial role in Unaizah's overall prosperity, establishing it as a prominent player in the global dates market.

2.3 Coffee Shops within Dates Farms: Boosting Local Economy

The integration of coffee shops within dates farms in Unaizah has had a significant impact on the local economy, creating a unique synergy between agricultural production and the hospitality industry. Coffee shops located within the farms have become popular destinations for both locals and tourists, attracting visitors who wish to experience the charm of the farm environment while enjoying a cup of coffee. The presence of coffee shops within dates farms has become a catalyst for promoting local products. These establishments often serve traditional Arabian coffee, which pairs perfectly with the dates produced on the farm (Al-Hedhaif, 2007). By offering a combination of freshly brewed coffee and locally grown dates, the coffee shops showcase the region's agricultural bounty and create a platform to market and sell the farm's produce directly to customers.

The success of coffee shops like Fay Coffee, Rahab Coffee and Jazla Coffee in Unaizah serves as an example of how these establishments have created entrepreneurial opportunities for the local community. These coffee shops are often run by local entrepreneurs who recognize the potential of combining the natural beauty of dates farms with the growing popularity of global coffee culture. By establishing and managing these coffee shops, entrepreneurs can generate income and contribute to the local economy (Maspul, 2023a; Frost *et al.*, 2010). The presence of coffee shops within dates farms also stimulates job creation. Not only do these establishments require staff to serve customers, but they also source ingredients and products from local farmers, creating a demand for their produce. This increased demand for dates and other local agricultural products leads to a positive ripple effect, supporting the livelihoods of farmers and encouraging further investment in agriculture.

Moreover, the integration of coffee shops within dates farms adds value to the overall farm experience. Visitors can immerse themselves in the serene and picturesque environment of the farm, enjoying the taste of freshly brewed coffee while surrounded by date palm trees and greenery. This unique ambiance enhances the overall visitor experience, attracting more people to the farms and increasing footfall. By offering *qahwa*, Unaizah embraces its tradition of hospitality and creates a sense of connection and warmth between hosts and guests (UNESCO, 2015; Mukhtar *et al.*, 2011; Watson & Waterton, 2013).

Dates, on the other hand, have deep cultural roots in Unaizah and are considered symbols of abundance, fertility, and prosperity. The region is renowned for its date palm groves, and date farming has been a vital part of the local economy for centuries. Beyond their economic value, dates hold a special place in the hearts of the community members. The harvesting and processing of dates are marked by communal celebrations and traditions that bring the community together. These rituals serve to reinforce the cultural identity of Unaizah and create a sense of belonging among its people. Dates are not only a staple food but also represent the heritage and bountiful nature of the region (Mukhtar *et al.*, 2011). Both traditional coffee culture and dates farming practices in Unaizah play a crucial role in preserving and honoring the traditions and heritage of the community. They act as a link to the past, connecting the present generation with their ancestors and their way of life. The knowledge and skills required for successful coffee and dates farming are passed down through generations, ensuring the continuity of traditional practices and maintaining a strong sense of cultural identity (Lin, 2010; Onciul *et al.*, 2017).

Furthermore, coffee and dates farming contribute significantly to the local economy and instill a sense of pride within the community. Unaizah's reputation as a hub for high-quality coffee and dates has gained recognition not only regionally but also internationally. The cultivation and production of these crops have created employment opportunities and boosted the local economy, establishing Unaizah as a thriving center for agriculture and trade. Moreover, coffee and dates farming in Unaizah, Saudi Arabia, hold immense cultural significance as symbols of hospitality, tradition, and prosperity. The creativity surrounding coffee drinking culture has made it easily adopted by millennials not only in the Middle East but also in various countries worldwide (Woldoff *et al.*, 2013; Maspul, 2021).

To understand the meanings and significance of coffee consumption among millennials,

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the sociocultural communication theory of symbolic interactionism is employed. Developed by George Herbert Mead and Herbert Blumer, symbolic interactionism explores how individuals form meaning and structure in society through their interactions and conversations (Blumer, 1966). It emphasizes that people act based on their subjective understandings of situations, and meanings are derived and transformed through social interaction. This theory underscores the interconnectedness of the self, mind, and society, highlighting how these elements influence individuals' practices and shape their understanding of themselves and others.

Within symbolic interactionism, the concept of self is developed through role-taking and assuming the perspective of others. Through these processes, individuals form a self-concept and come to perceive themselves as others see them. The mind represents the process of aligning oneself with this self-concept, which is vital for human existence and social interactions. The symbolic interactionism provides a framework to explore the experiences and meanings associated with coffee drinking among millennials (Blumer, 2013; Gourville & Soman, 1998). Moreover, coffee consumption is constructed through millennials' initial encounters with coffee, their consumer behavior, and their daily interactions in various contexts; a comprehensive understanding of the significance of coffee in the lives of millennials can be gained, shedding light on their cultural practices, self-perception, and social interactions.

3.3 Transmission of Local Wisdom through Generations

The intergenerational transfer of knowledge and traditions is crucial for preserving local wisdom. Preserving local wisdom and ensuring its continuity heavily relies on the intergenerational transfer of knowledge and traditions. One notable example of this transmission can be found in the town of Unaizah, where the coffee culture and dates has served as a means to pass down the community's wisdom from older generations to the younger ones. Traditional communities hold a wealth of knowledge and cultural practices that are unique to their way of life (Mungmachon, 2012; Maspul, 2022). These communities prioritize self-sufficiency, mutual support, and cooperation, forming tightly-knit social structures. Within these communities, the transfer of knowledge from elders to younger generations is a crucial process for preserving their local wisdom.

In addition, the diverse age range of visitors adds to the uniqueness of consumer behavior in this place. Many of them consider it an educational destination to understand the roots of their ancestral culture by experiencing a sustainable lifestyle through the blending of coffee culture and dates farming. In response to being asked about their experience visiting the dates farming location and enjoying specialty coffee in the evening, the customer expressed:

"I chose this particular establishment over other coffee shops in Unaizah because of its captivating heritage atmosphere, which enhances my well-being while savoring a cup of coffee in a historically soothing and comfortable setting," – AA.

In Unaizah, the cultivation of dates and coffee consumption has become a means to pass down ancestral knowledge and traditions. Older members of the community, who have spent their lives perfecting the art of coffee culture and dates farming, play a pivotal role in teaching the younger generation the intricacies of these practices. They pass on their expertise, techniques, and the wisdom acquired through years of experience (Mungmachon, 2012; Abul-Soad *et al.*, 2017). Moreover, the transmission of local wisdom through generations is vital for the preservation and continuity of traditional communities. The example of Unaizah's coffee and dates farming demonstrates the significance of passing down not just technical skills but also the cultural values and traditions that define a community. Through this intergenerational transfer, traditional communities can safeguard their wisdom and ensure its relevance in an ever-changing world.

4. Environmental Sustainability in Coffee Culture and Dates Farming in Unaizah
